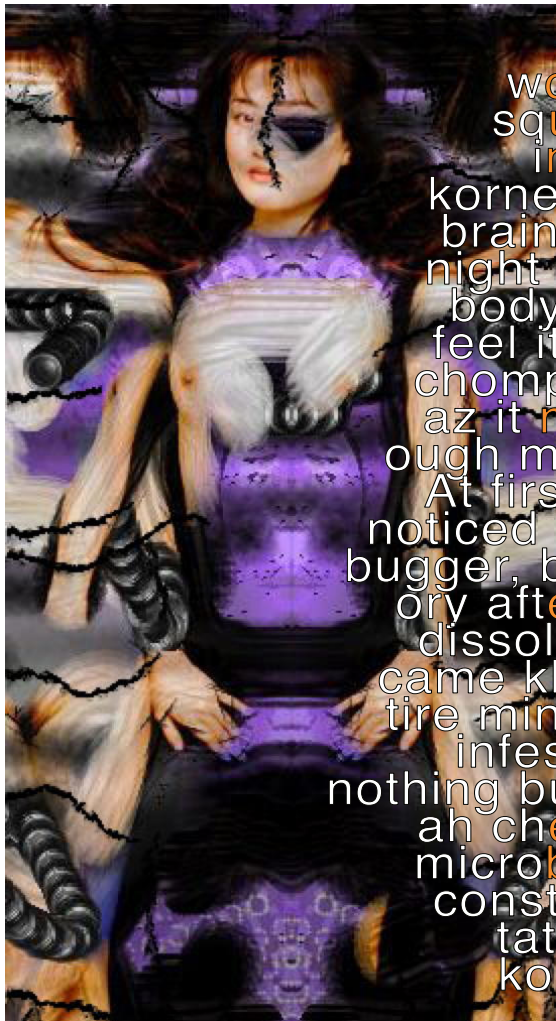


CYBER WORM:
