we'll live forever.

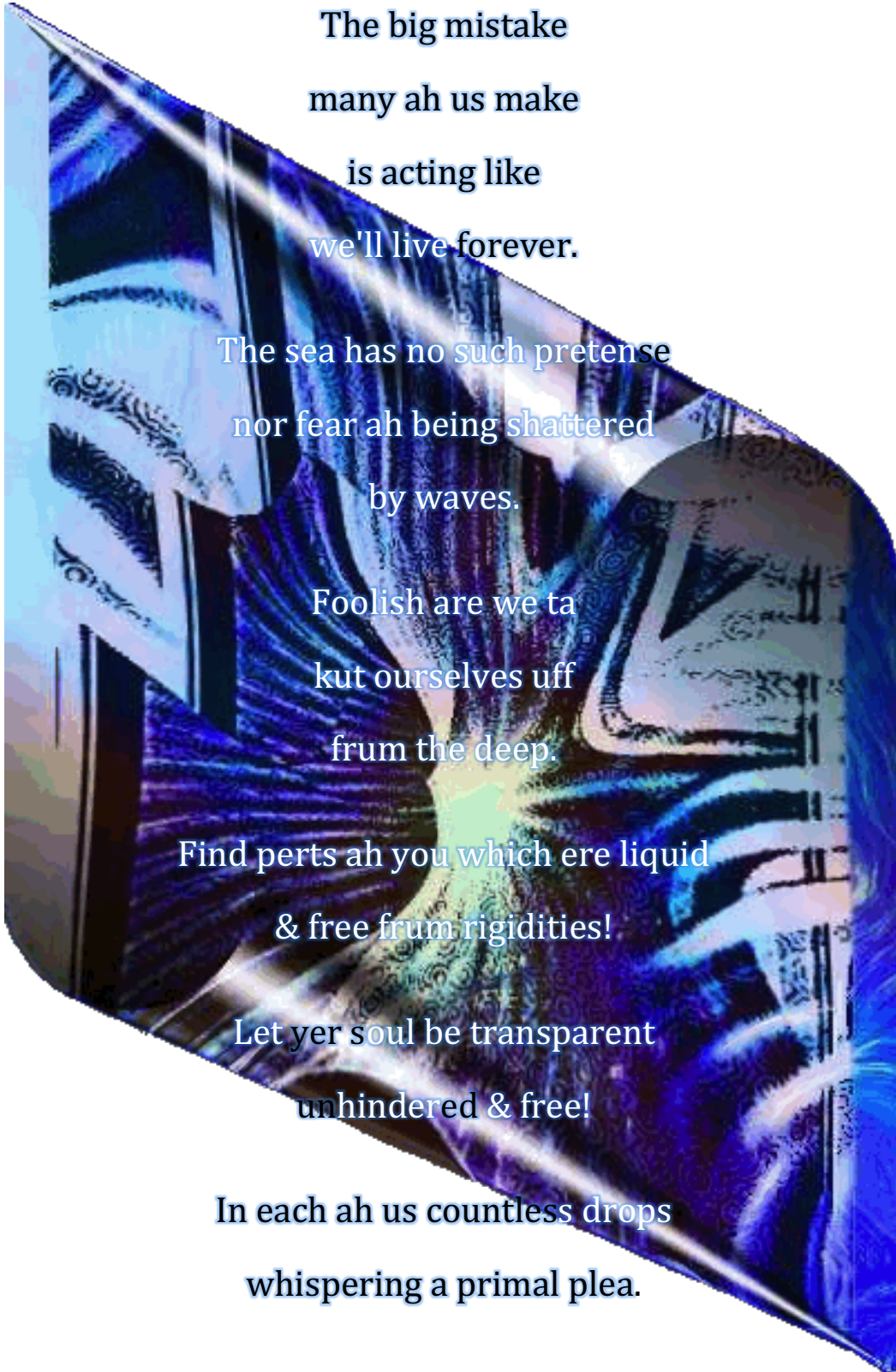
The sea has no such pretense
